hanks to all who participated in our annual appeal. This past year was a good one for the Foundation with 294 contributions totaling over \$110,000! These funds supported 3 full-time campers and 22 half-session campers, representing ten states and the District of Columbia. Individual awards ranged from \$500 to \$6,900.

This year, the Board of Directors asked George "Biff" Sutcliffe to take on the reins as Executive Director. Over the last fifty years, generations of alumni have witnessed Biff's can-do mentality and contributions as a counselor and handyman. The Board feels he is an excellent fit for advancing the Foundation's data management and outreach activities, particularly engaging younger alums.

We are also delighted that Henry Damon will be staying on as Campership Administrator, where he will be leading efforts at bringing in a diverse group of campers who are a good fit for Deerwood and who need financial assistance. Henry has served the Foundation admirably as a board member and Executive Director, and he will now be ensuring continued success of its central mission.


Ed Strapp and his fundraising swims from Camp Asquam to Camp Deerwood

Auction History and the Auction 2017

An update from Auction Chair Denny O'Brien

In 1998 a number of Deerwood counselors and parents wanted to help the Foundation raise money for scholarships. Len and I talked with Rock Hudson, Tod Campbell, Dan Thomsen, Biff Sutcliffe, and Jeff Thomsen to come up with handmade items that might make up a silent auction. Len and I also talked to a few talented parents: Jeannie Merrick-Maddux and Kay Fischer who offered original water colors and antique artifacts with a Deerwood theme. And then there were the devoted grandparents, like Helen Mathieson and Henry Damon who repeatedly came up with donated items with great success.

We all felt that parents' weekend would provide a great venue. So, we put together the auction with a Hudson forge item, a Dan Thomsen shop project, a Jeff photo, a Biff woodwork item, a Jeannie painting and a Kay artifact. We also produced a publication entitled "Camp Classics" with campers' favorite recipes and a lot of Deerwood history and stories. (This is in its 4th printing and has sold more than 400 copies.)

That first year we raised \$1,135 and then \$3,209 the next year; we now raise between \$8,000 and \$14,000 every year from an average of 25 to 30 donated items. All have a Deerwood theme or connection and include forge items, art work, needlepoint belts, knit wool caps, ceramics, wood crafts, handmade quilts, old maps, framed photos, and even a cedar strip wooden canoe contributed by the CITs that sold for \$7,000 in 2010! Thanks to the generosity of the Deerwood staff, parents, alumni, and grandparents, the Auction has raised more than \$180,000 since 1998, all funding camp scholarships.

Deerwood Foundation Experience From This Summer

A young friend could have attended a camp for ten days close to his city this past summer. Yes, he could have learned to swim and try his hand at archery there but the closest he would have gotten to the experience of forging iron would have been roasting marshmallows in a camp fire. My family wanted more for him. We wanted the unrelenting beauty and experiences of Deerwood.

We learned about the Foundation through Henry and Lorne. Could our young friend qualify for a Foundation grant? We risked suggesting Deerwood to the boy's mother who, after looking at the website, told us she liked that Deerwood "has lots of nature".

The abundant generosity of the Deerwood Foundation, coupled with the patient and courteous help that Lorne and Henry gave the boy's mother as they worked together through the application process, allowed a fine young man to stretch and grow in more ways than he -- or we -- could have imagined!

For a boy who previously had climbed nothing taller than Rattlesnake, to climb Jefferson and Washington is priceless. For him to try riflery and badminton, be challenged in archery and swimming, with the careful attention of excellent counselors, and to learn what fun a musical can be, is priceless.

But, of course, it *does* come with a price. And for the Deerwood Foundation to cover the lion's share of the boy's Deerwood experience (minus a nominal contribution from the family) resulted in a lifechanging experience for a sincerely grateful young man.

<u>Deerwood Foundation Experience From Summers A While Ago</u>

I've only previously shared this story with my wife. When I was an 8-year-old in Sheraton in 1996, I caught a bat. Specifically, a Little Brown Bat. I knew this because I was a solitary, nature-obsessed 8-year-old. He was sick, clearly not taking flight any time soon. I left him with some bugs I knocked out of spider webs around the boathouse and promised to come back. He had passed away by the time I returned. I buried him in a jar under Sheraton and never disturbed that dirt again until after restorations to the cabin years later. I like to picture Biff with a shovel being surprised to dig up this treasure, but it's more likely that one of the Hall brothers, Rich brothers, or Ibarra brothers watching over Sheraton that summer was wise to my memorial service and kindly never embarrassed me with the retelling.

I came to Deerwood while big changes were happening at home. Only years later did I learn of the Deerwood Foundation through the generosity of early donors who made me among the first, possibly the very first, to be able to proudly follow my big brother to Camp when my family wasn't in a position to send me. I was never a shoe-in for Happiest Camper, most likely in that summer of '96 to be found flipping rocks in moosewood groves looking for big bugs and salamanders. For me, it was really an enduring friendship made through collusion in pranks on Moon Island that marked a turning point in my life at Camp and beyond. Though still oddly interested in bats, I at least went out for the play and brought home a couple banners to pin on my wall. Lasting friendships were forged that summer.

We all cherish those friends - counselors and peers alike - with whom we endured the challenges of Camp and that laid a foundation for how we would conduct ourselves, and the stories we'd tell, until the next summer. Riverside ice cream after grueling trips, first candles snuffed on the range, nailing the high notes to Goodnight Dear Deerwood, right along with the deepest pangs of homesickness and gutwrenching losses to the Blues.

No encounter is more fun for me today than a Deerwood alumnus, of any vintage, with whom to share memories of Squam and possibly engage in some contest of our campcraft skills. To those who contributed to the Foundation's mission in its early days, I remain forever grateful. To those recalling your own time at Camp, consider the Deerwood experiences, friendships, and lessons that have likely enriched your life as well.
