# Summer of 2019 Campership Summary

For our 25th summer the Deerwood Foundation sponsored a total of 28 half-time equivalent camperships. A half-time equivalent is a three-and-half week session at Camp Deerwood. Six of the boys were here for the full summer. The boys represented the States of: FL, VT, NH, MA, OK, NY CT, RI, VA and CO. Of the 22 boys, 10 were "new" to Deerwood, 3 were here for their 2nd year, 2 for their 3rd year, 4 for their 4th year and 3 had been here for 5 or more years! Our tuition awards ranged from 31% to 99%. Awards ranged from \$1,600 to \$7,700. Our campers represented approximately 12% of the camper population.

# The Tree Talk Fellowship A new initiative for the Deerwood Foundation:

For its first 25 years the Deerwood Foundation has focused on providing young boys ages 8-15 with camperships for as many years as each was able. While this is still the primary mission of the Foundation, we noticed that among our sponsored campers, young men emerged with leadership skills who we would like to return as junior counselors and counselors. To help these young men, whose family resources have proven to be worthy of scholarship assistance, make a summer of working at Deerwood possible, we have instituted the Tree Talk Fellowship. This fellowship is designed to grant financial assistance in the form of a sum of money paid directly to an institution for any post-high school education/certificate program. Candidates must first secure a job offer from Camp Deerwood and then are eligible to apply for a fellowship. Awards can vary depending on the number of candidates and they must be utilized within a certain number of years after graduating from high school. Funding for these Fellowships will be from our annual donation program which we have been fortunate enough to maintain at a level that will allow for this additional mission. Thank you to all who make this happen!!

### Thank You for 25 years of Generosity

Over 6,300 donations to the Deerwood Foundation have supported nearly 500 camperships for over \$1,500,000. From the summer of 1995 with \$6,000 in camperships to this past year with over \$101,000 in camperships, your generous support is helping give boys a summer of adventure and a lifetime of memories. The Foundation is well positioned to continue providing opportunities to those in need. As we head into our 26<sup>th</sup> year we look forward to making the "Deerwood Experience" available to another generation of campers. We are all better for it! Thank you.

#### A chance to purchase "Some Kid"

"Some Kid" was Deerwood's first Lightning sailboat. Buck purchased it from Lusty's Marina in York Harbor, ME. in time for the summer of 1964. Sometime in the mid-70s, the boat was no longer usable and went to a shed. Henry Damon (former camper and counselor) took it off Camp's hands, stripped the exterior and applied epoxy, repainted the interior, redid the mahogany trim and obtained newer sails. After a decade of fun sailing at his place on Dog Cove on Squam Lake, new challenges in his life prevented him from maintaining it so the boat went into storage for 27 years. The past two summers he has done another refurbishing of it and he believes the boat has some good years left in it! Before putting it up for sale on the internet he wants to let the Deerwood community know about the boat in case someone wants a large, usable - for at least some years - piece of Deerwood memorabilia.
